Volunteer Spotlight

Hannah Amaya first learned about CERT in the early days of her high school tenure at San Marcos High School.

"Our criminal justice teacher and the Hays County Pct. 1 Office showed us how to do a search and rescue operation," Hannah said.

She was a high school senior when COVID hit and locked things down for months. Her freshman year at Texas State University (TXST) was not the norm for a college student. But she realized sometimes, you just have to push through.

"I'm a first-generation college student," Hannah said. "I knew I had to just keep moving forward."

One thing that helped that first year was getting involved in campus groups. Hannah said she joined the Sociology Club to make friends, since her classes were mostly online.

In her senior year, Hannah and two other students created a TXST chapter of the Austin Sunshine Camp; it's a camp for foster kids.

"We had 42 members by the end of the year," she said.

What was her secret to getting so many other students involved?

"Appeal to people's heart, honestly," she said.

She recalled how at fraternity house presentations, she would appeal to their sense of a male identity crisis.

"I'd tell them these kids are lost right now," she said. "I'd show them how they could impact someone's life. How they could be a good role model."

She graduated with a degree in Applied Sociology and Criminal Justice minor. Hannah is now a graduate student working toward her MA in Public Administration, also at Texas State.

She said her educational experience thus far helped her understand that there are different perspectives in life. It also led her toward working for a nonprofit or as a public servant.

"My dad is a public servant," she said.

"I know that I want to do something where I can give back to the community," she said. "I could never work for an insurance company or something like that."

This year, she is an intern with Hays County OES and helps with Hays County CERT.

Why OES?

"I needed an internship in government," she said. "And I learned that emergency services is everything you can think of including public outreach. I've learned so much that I didn't learn in school."

Part of her OES internship includes working with Candy Lonie on CERT and with the SRP task force.

"SRP has been my favorite so far," Hannah said. "The work is very optimistic. We work as one county, one team."

Hannah recently attended a symposium at the Texas School Safety Center where OES Planner Laurie Taylor was presenting.

Her work with CERT includes partnering with Thundercloud Subs, Hannah's employer for the past five years.

"I help coordinate getting food during CERT deployments with first responders," she said. "Making sure our first responders and our CERT volunteers are fed is huge. Giving is a powerful tool."

Thundercloud Subs also generously agreed to provide lunch for CERT volunteers during the upcoming <u>Hays County Emergency Preparedness Fair</u>, happening Sept. 13 at La Verde Park in Kyle.

What does Hannah like about CERT?

"Seeing how motivated and determined folks are in this organization," she said. "Everyone cares. The volunteers embody public service."

She added that she also sees how the community pulls together and shows its humanity during a crisis.

"Working here encouraged me to put in my application to the TXST Campus CERT," she said.

PS - We're fairly sure she will be accepted.

Fun Fact:

Hannah just built her own PC. From scratch! How did she learn to do that? She said It's kind of a hobby. "I was determined to make my own PC," she said. She watched YouTube videos and read tutorials, learning more about the process each day. She even named this PC: **Roxanne**! "It meant a lot to do it myself," she said.

FIVE ALARM LEADERSHIP: REAL LEADERSHIP WITH REAL PEOPLE

Five Alarm Leadership is a dynamic program that is designed to energize and motivate the people in your department to perform and excel in everything they do. This program outlines many of the common situations that fire departments and fire companies find themselves in and presents suggestions and solutions to those situations. Chief Lasky, a 40-plus year veteran of the fire service has experienced many of the challenges and hurdles that your fire department is facing. He has learned through his experience as a company grade officer, commandlevel officer, and executive officer, how to treat people, how to motivate them, mentor, to coach and counsel them, and in some cases discipline them, so that they want to come back and contribute even more to this great profession. Issues such as integrity, inspiration, interest, innovation, insight and initiative are all discussed and applied to life in the firehouse and on the fireground. Join Chief Lasky as he guides you through your most difficult but vital role as a leader in the fire service.



CHIEF RICK LASKY is a 40-plus year veteran of the fire service. Rick followed in his father's footsteps beginning his career as a firetighter in the suburbs on the southwest side of Chicago and while in Illinois received the 1996 International Society of Fire Service Instructors "Innovator of the Year" award for his part in developing the "Saving Our Own" program. He served as the co-lead instructor tor the H.O.T. Firetighter Survival program at FDIC tor over 10 years, is a long-standing editorial advisory board member for Fire Engineering Magazine and also serves on the FDIC advisory board. Rick is the author at the best-selling books "Pride & Ownership: A Firetighter's Love at the Job" and "Five Alarm Leadership: From the Firehouse to the Fireground" published by Fire Engineering Books and is the co-host for the podcast "The Command Past" heard on FireEngineering.com as well as the podcast "Old School." Rick has served as both a career and volunteer tiretighter and in 2017 was the recipient of the Tom Brennan Litetime Achievement Award.
