Volunteer Spotlight

Sheila Sidberry-Thomas is what you might call an energetic woman of a certain age. She is also the pastor at the oldest black church in San Marcos, Wesley Chapel AME.

This Philadelphia native ended up in Texas in about 2009. Why Texas?

"I don't like the snow," she said.

She lives in San Antonio and was a pastor there for about fifteen years. In total she's been a pastor for 19.

"This is my fourth year in San Marcos," she said.

Sheila hasn't considered moving to San Marcos but is active in the community.

"I attend city council meetings to learn what's going on around town," she said.

She also volunteers when she can for the Southside Community Center; she is a member of the San Marcos Ministerial Alliance and the Hays County Homeless Coalition.

Was it a big change coming to preach in a relatively small town, compared to San Antonio?

In some ways, she said, yes.

"I don't have the resources as readily available," she said.

How did she get involved with Hays County CERT?

Members of her congregation told her about CERT. She said they strongly encouraged her to get the free training CERT provides.

"They told me, 'We need to go be part of this organization,"" she said. "I didn't know what CERT was."

They all signed up for the course in the fall of 2024.

"I paid attention as best I could," she said.

And some of the course, particularly the medical aspects, may have come easy for Sheila. She was an EMT when she lived in Philly.

"In a past life, I was an EMT, certified in CPR," she said. "I was volunteering in Philly right after college at an ambulance company not far from where I lived. They offered EMT classes."

So, she took the training.

"I really enjoyed it - driving the ambulance and taking care of the patients," she said. "You had to be certified in CPR and I kept up with the certifications for a while even after I left."

Sheila added that CERT brought back a lot of those teachings.

Is she enjoying being a CERT member?

"Yes, and I'm getting to know the Hays County community a little better," she said. "I help out mostly at events on days as I can adjust my schedule better."

She isn't always able to attend CERT training, because weekends are a busy time for a pastor.

What she likes is there is something for everybody in CERT.

"You do it when you can," she said.

What does she like best about CERT?

"Volunteering makes me happy," she said. "I'm able to help someone else.

She added that CERT is a bit different – you're not just helping an individual.

"Now we're helping communities," she said. "We get to see how we can assist whole communities. We share information and help them be prepared."

Sheila also enjoys working with the other volunteers and meeting new people.

"I like to reconnect with those I've met," she said, "And I started working with students at Texas State."







Registration is a 2-step process: **First**, email the class instructor Gary White at w5gw1956@gmail.com with your name, email, and telephone number and a copy of your driver's license or passport.

Second, you will receive a welcome packet containing the Discord access link and a link to pay the non-refundable VE test fee (\$14.00) by PayPal or check to the provided address. You will not be registered until the VE test fee is paid.
